Photographs by Arthur Sawyers, young Chicago free-lance photographer, will be on exhibition at The Art Institute of Chicago from October 5 through December 1, 1968, in gallery 106. The show will include about sixty prints in both black and white and color. Included is a series on Mrs. Della Carr, a senior citizen who has lived in Central City, Kentucky all her life and who is the grandmother of Sawyer's wife. Photographs of Kentucky and the photographer's view of Chicago and its environs will also be exhibited.

Sawyers, who was born in Washington, D. C. 28 years ago, has worked as a free lance photographer in Chicago for the past two years. He was formerly a staff photographer at Colonial Williamsburg, Virginia for a year and served as a photographer during his Army career. He has also worked for the Hedrich-Blessing Studio, Chicago.

His photographs have appeared in Chicago Magazine, as well as the periodicals of the Kiwanis Club and Allstate Insurance. Sawyer's photographs are included in the permanent collection of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York City.
