At scheduled times during the run of the exhibition *Hero, Hawk, and Open Hand: American Indian Art of the Ancient Midwest and South*, ancient objects will be brought to life by contemporary Native American artists-in-residence. Potter Jereldine Redcorn and shell carvers Knokovtee Scott and Dan Townsend will demonstrate their crafts, which have been acclaimed for reviving ancient traditions and motifs.

ARTIST BIOGRAPHIES:

Knokovtee William Scott

(Creek-Cherokee) creates luminous purple mussel-shell jewelry that is delicate in form yet precisely carved. Scott earned a B.A. degree from Northeastern State University in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, in 1969 and a master's degree in education from University Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma in 1987.

Jereldine Redcorn

(Caddo and Potawatomi) earned a B.S. degree from Wayland University in 1962 and an M.A. degree from Pennsylvania State University in 1976. Although Redcorn is also accomplished in ribbonwork, fingerweaving, and woodland floral appliqué, Caddo traditional pottery is her primary professional artistic endeavor.

Dan Townsend

(Creek-Cherokee) follows in the footsteps of his ancestors by carving ancient designs and symbols on shell. His work can be seen in collections throughout the world. His pieces are used by a number of tribal communities as instruments in ceremonial teachings. Townsend is based in Tallahassee, Florida.
